The Saskatchewan Aboriginal Land Technicians Board is currently looking for 3 new Directors for the Board to be filled by August 31, 2020. SALT Board members are involved in connecting with people across the province around land management issues, developing and attending conferences and workshops, and providing governance for the SALT office and staff. The Board of Directors communicate by email and video conferences on a regular basis. The board meetings are held 4 times per year and are held at different locations in the province.

SALT is a progressive body that seeks to help and assist current and future Land Managers to improve their First Nation through education, training and conferences to provide historical, current and up to date and forthcoming legislation and information that can impact First Nations in Saskatchewan.
